## Where MSJMC staff should park

As we work on building a new parking garage for Mercy San Juan employees, there's no question that parking on campus has become more of a challenge.

To address that challenge, Mercy San Juan has devoted considerable resources to contract with a parking company that offers "stacked" parking within the parking garage. We also have a parking shuttle seven days a week to make it more convenient for staff and visitors to get from one part of the campus to another.

All Mercy San Juan employees are expected to park in the current garage.

The reason where you park is so important is because we're receiving constant messages from the medical office buildings on campus that patients are either late or missing appointments because the parking spaces closest to the buildings are full. Property managers raise the concern that they believe hospital employees are choosing to park in these spaces rather than park in the garage.

You should not avoid the garage thinking there won't be room for you. Since construction began, there has not been a time when the garage has reached its full capacity. If all of the parking stalls are occupied, parking attendants will provide

you with a place to park behind another vehicle. They will ask for contact information and then give you a claim ticket in exchange for your keys. The parking service is offered from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. At the end of their shift, attendants will attempt to bring your keys to you. If they can't locate you, they will turn the keys over to Security.

Security is monitoring lots for the medical office buildings at 6401, 6403 and 6555 Coyle Avenue.

Employees who continue to park in these lots could receive tickets that could eventually lead to disciplinary action. They also run the risk of having their vehicles towed if property managers should choose to take that action. The one exception is night staff, who can park in these lots after 7 p.m., as long as their vehicle is moved by 7 a.m.

Because it can take longer to park on campus while the new employee garage is being completed, please consider allowing yourself an extra 10 minutes when arriving for work. The new garage is expected to open in July or August of 2008.
