## Coping with parking on campus

It's no secret that parking will be a daily challenge at Mercy San Juan while the new gated employee garage is being built behind the hospital.

We've seen much change the last few days. As a result, we now have a few days experience with valet parking for our patients and visitors, and a few days experience with stacking vehicles in the parking garage.

### What we're doing to help

What you can expect to see in coming days will be more signage, improved lighting and information from parking attendants that will help visitors and employees navigate through the construction zones on campus. It is our goal to seek solutions that provide enhanced safety and service.

Cooperation will be key, too. For most of us, that means parking in the garage – either in available employee spaces (2<sup>nd</sup> floor and above) or allowing your vehicle to be stacked.

In order for there to be enough parking for patients visiting physicians and services in the 6401 and 6403 Coyle Ave. medical office buildings, we're asking

Mercy San Juan employees to avoid parking in the main lot for those MOB's. Contractually, we have a long-term land lease with the owner of the 6403 building that requires Mercy San Juan to keep a certain number of spaces available for visitors.

### Parking enforcement

To enforce parking in those lots, Security will have an increased presence. Keep in mind that Mercy employees, as in the past, CAN park in the 6401 and 6403 lots after hours (from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m.)

We're also asking that Mercy San Juan employees respect our neighbors by refraining from parking on surface streets.

### Commute alternatives

During the approximate 9 months of construction for the new parking garage, one alternative you can explore is how else you can get to work (walking, bicycling, transit, carpool, vanpools, etc).
