Answering your parking questions

Q: Is the current parking garage structurally able to hold all of the additional vehicles once we start stacking cars?

A: Yes. We have contacted the architect and the engineers involved in building the structure. They say the structure was designed to accommodate the additional weight of stacking vehicles throughout the garage.

Q: Where do I park if I get to work before parking attendants start stacking cars?

A: Wherever there is an open space from the 2nd floor on up. If your car is blocked when parking attendants start stacking cars, a parking attendant will move the car so you can leave.

Q: Will there be a delay in me leaving the garage?

A: The delay will be minimal. If you have a standing commitment immediately after work, please let the parking attendants know.

Q: If I get off work after parking attendants have turned over keys to Security, how will I know if my car is blocked or not?

A: All cars will be unstacked before parking attendants leave for the day.

Q: Who assumes the risk of liability if something happens to my vehicle while the parking attendant is moving it?

A: If any damage is done to your vehicle by a parking attendant, Parking Solutions will be responsible.

Q: How safe is my vehicle going to be with this new parking arrangement?

A: We expect cars in the garage to be safer due to the presence of parking attendants. It is still everyone's responsibility to keep vehicles safe by not leaving valuables in plain sight.

Q: Will volunteer spaces currently in the back of the hospital be relocated?

A: Not during the construction of the new gated employee parking garage. Volunteer spaces will be relocated once the garage is finished.
